Edited Excerpts:

I have a Task: To foster all mankind and ensure for all of them lives full of bliss. I have a Vow: To lead all who stray away from the straight path again into goodness and save them. I am attached to a work that I love: To remove the sufferings of the poor and grant them what they lack. I have a reason to be proud, for I rescue all who worship and adore me. I have my definition of the 'devotion' I expect: Those devoted to me have to treat joy and grief, gain and loss, with equal fortitude. This means that I will never give up those who attach themselves to me.

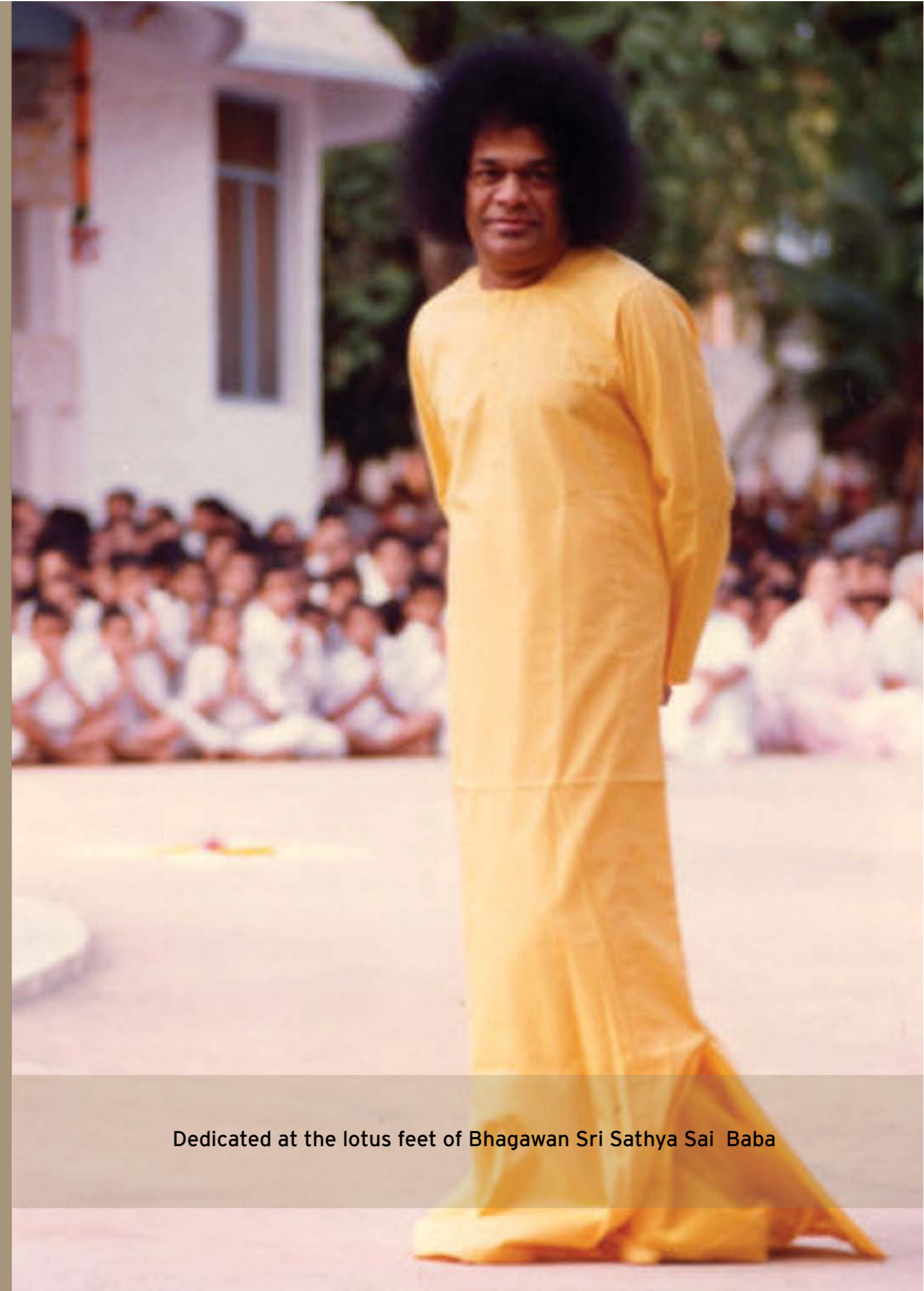
I will not give up my mission, nor my determination. I know I will carry them out. I treat the honor and dishonor, the fame and blame that may be the consequence, with equanimity. Internally, I am unconcerned. I act but in the outer world; I talk and move about for the sake of the outer world and for announcing my coming to the people; else, I have no concern even with these.

I do not belong to any place; I am not attached to any name. I have no "mine" or "thine". I answer whatever the name you use. I go wherever I am taken. This is my very first vow. I have not disclosed this to anyone so far. For me, the world is something afar, apart. I act and move only for the sake of mankind.

No one can comprehend my glory, whoever he is, whatever his method of enquiry, however long his attempt. You can yourself see the full glory in the coming years. Devotees must have patience and forbearance.

I am not concerned, nor am I anxious, that these facts should be known. I have no need to write these words; I wrote them because I felt you would be pained if I do not reply.

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SPECIAL REPORT

of the Trustees for the period April 24-October 30, 2011

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The last one year has been a very challenging one for each one of us. The world at large, and particularly all the adherents to His teaching and message, were devastated by the sudden physical departure of our founder Trustee Sri Sathya Sai Baba on the 24th of April 2011. Nothing could ever have prepared us for what was in store.

No words that are written or spoken by anyone can completely assuage our grief or allay our apprehensions. But He did not leave without showing us the way forward. His legacy of love, in the form of service in the various philanthropic institutions He had personally set up and overseen, and the discipline which He infused in their daily operation is now the path we must follow.

As the Founder Trustee of these institutions, He has specified the role each one of us must assume. Unstinting commitment and dedication to His mission is the only salve that will steer us through the difficult times.

The Board of Trustees have their responsibilities laid out clearly for them. Baba, as the Founder Trustee, has been directing, advising and guiding us all these years. Now, in His physical absence, the Trustees too need to act in such a way that His message and mission are carried forward.

Prior to April 2011, there were only the five Trustees, originally nominated by Bhagawan in March 2010, viz. Justice P. N. Bhagwati, Sri Indulal Shah, Sri S. V. Giri, Sri V. Srinivasan and Sri R. J. Ratnakar. Later, with a view to broaden the base of the Board of Trustees, four more trustees – Sri K. Chakravarti, Sri S. S. Naganand, Sri T. K. K. Bhagavat, and Sri J. V. Shetty - were co-opted to the Board.

This Annual Report is for the period April 1st 2010 to March 31st 2011. This special report places on record and highlights some of the activities of the Trust subsequent to this period as well. The transition from the era of continuous personal guidance from the Founder Trustee, to one of establishing systems and procedures, and conforming to that framework, called for a change in the mental makeup and the ability to respond quickly to issues for all concerned. The Board of Trustees recognised that this was essential in order to reflect greater transparency. In keeping with these requirements, the Trustees report the following significant decisions and actions that were taken in the period between April 2011 and October 2011:

- The Board of Trustees resolved to bring out an Annual Report which will be released on 23rd November each year. This is the first such report.
- The Board of Trustees has met five times during this period to deliberate on various matters and authorise appropriate actions.
- A Board of Management (BOM) of the Trust has been constituted consisting of Sri S. V. Giri, Sri V. Srinivasan, and Sri R. J. Ratnakar to deal with operational matters. The BOM has met nine times during this period; it will meet a minimum of once and sometimes twice in a month. All decisions and minutes of the meetings of the BOM are scrutinized by the Board of Trustees and subsequently ratified by them.
- In order to ensure that they continue to serve as Trustees with the same degree of devotion and integrity consistent with the teachings of the Founder, the Trustees have voluntarily adopted and agreed to follow rigorously a code of conduct.
- Adequate internal audit mechanisms and systems and procedures have been introduced.
- All the hospitals at Prasanthi Nilayam and Whitefield have been supported with necessary resources to continue to maintain the same degree of excellence as before.
- The Institute of Higher Learning commenced its academic year exactly on the scheduled date with satisfactory intake of new students as before.
- The elegant Mahasamadhi was constructed and unveiled on the Guru Pournima day, and is now attracting devotees from all over the world.
- All festivals and functions were observed and celebrated on schedule as before. Dassera was celebrated with the Veda Purusha Saptaha Yagnam.
- Grama Seva (village service) was conducted by University Students in 120 villages around Puttaparthi for ten days, with free distribution of clothes and food, as always.
- Pay scales of the University, Hospital and School staff have been revised in line with the guidelines of the Central and State Government. This will increase our wage bill by Rs 10.1 crore (30 per cent) in 2011-12.
- An Advance Tax of Rs 14.57 crore was paid in full to the Income Tax Department of India on the basis of the actual inventory of articles at Prasanthi Nilayam, Puttaparthi and at Brindavan, Bangalore. The inventories were done by the Trustees in the presence of independent witnesses, and/or government officials invited by us to act as observers.
- The Trust has initiated several new programs and projects consistent with its objectives. Some of these are
 - (a) Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini Program
 - (b) Teacher Training Programs
 - (c) Additions of Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospitals in selected cities

- (d) Assistance to Sathya Sai Schools in several parts of India
- The Trust is actively considering several new initiatives. Some of these are
 - (a) Additional Staff accommodation
 - (b) Additional advanced equipment for the hospitals
 - (c) Augmentation of infrastructure at the University campuses
 - (d) Expansion of scope of Sri Sathya Sai Anna Prasadam.
- The Trust is conscious of the additional demand on its resources on account of the above mentioned steps, but is confident of meeting the requirements by careful husbanding of its resources and exercising the required prudence and control in spending.

We gratefully acknowledge the continuous support and assistance we have been receiving from the Governments of Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka.

We draw inspiration from Baba's vision for the Trust and the constant love and support from fellow devotees. Whenever we think of the last few months, what stands vividly in our memory is the five hundred thousand people who filed past the mortal remains of our immortal Master, with devotion, dignity and discipline, truly reflecting His Teachings. This half a million, consisted of devotees young and old, men and women, rich and poor of every creed, caste and culture. To all of them, we are grateful for the great devotion and support shown which helped us in our task. In particular, we would like to express our grateful appreciation to the Seva Dals (active service volunteers) hailing from all over the country, who stood as silent sentinel, and the students and alumni of Sai schools and colleges who stood shoulder to shoulder with us, truly reflecting unity of purpose.

While each day brought with it newer challenges, it also strengthened our belief that the support of Sai devotees, students and sevadals will ensure that these Institutions built by our beloved Founder shall grow with greater vigour.

We, the Trustees of the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust, rededicate ourselves to this task.

SRI SATHYA SAI CENTRAL TRUST

The Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust was founded in 1972 by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba as a public charitable trust with the objectives of extending relief to the poor, including education and health, and any other objects of general public utility as defined in section 2(15) of the Indian Income Tax Act of 1991, without any discrimination.

Based on the five core human values of truth, right conduct, peace, love and non-violence, the Trust operates two Super Specialty Hospitals; two general hospitals; a three-campus deemed University described by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) as a crest jewel of the Indian University Education system; and an extensive school system from Classes I to XII. The Trust also provides clean drinking water to over a million villagers in five districts of Andhra Pradesh, and to ten million residents of the city of Chennai, Tamil Nadu. The Trust is led by a board of nine members, who take inspiration from the life of Bhagawan Baba, marked by unconditional love and selfless service.

All services provided by the Trust, including education and medical care, are totally free of cost and are open to all.

The Trust does not solicit funds nor has it so far accepted funds from Governments. All contributions to the Trust are voluntary from individuals who see Baba's projects executed efficiently and offering immense relief to the greatest number of people.

Some of the major projects executed are detailed below:

- The Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning (Established in 1981) with campuses at Anantapur, Prasanthi Nilayam, Puttaparthi and Whitefield near Bangalore. This University extends higher education to men and women totally free of cost. Currently the fourth campus of the deemed University at Muddannahalli is ready and awaiting clearance from the Government of India.
- A general hospital, established in 1956, two super specialty hospitals in 1991 and 2001, and one mobile hospital in 2006 to extend advanced medical treatment to poor patients, totally free of cost. Hundreds of thousands of people from all over the country, predominantly from the lower strata of society, have benefitted from these hospitals.
- Rural drinking water supply projects have been established in the districts of Anantapur, Medak, Mahboobnagar, and tribal areas of East and West Godavari, to cover about 1,500 villages. These projects were completely executed by the Trust and then handed over to the Government of Andhra Pradesh, and given to them free of cost.
- Modernised the Telugu Ganga Canal to ensure supply of Krishna water as contracted by the Government of Andhra Pradesh to Chennai city.
- Extended large-scale relief during the earthquake in Gujarat, the Tsunami in Tamil Nadu, and the floods in Orissa. Over 700 houses were constructed in Orissa for those who were affected by the floods. These were given to them free of cost.

Shri G. S. R. C. V. Prasada Rao, I.A.S (Rtd.), formerly Secretary, Government of Andhra Pradesh and member A.P. Administrative Tribunal, was appointed Secretary of the Trust in the month of September 2011.

OTHER INDEPENDENT TRUSTS

Besides the above, the following four independent Trusts / Societies function in Prasanthi Nilayam, and carry on charitable / religious activities.

SRI SATHYA SAI SADHANA TRUST

This religious Trust, registered in Bangalore on 3 October 2008, carries on certain activities of public utility for serving devotees / visitors in Prasanthi Nilayam and Brindavan, Bangalore through the following divisions:

(i) Bhaktha Sahayak Division: provides food to the pilgrims through three canteens; maintains a Goshala; runs Prasanthi General Stores, where all basic necessities are available at modest prices; runs telephone booths; etc.

(ii) Mahila Division: provides training to ladies from rural areas for cooking, tailoring; provides fluoride-free filtered and processed clean drinking water, etc

(iii) Media Division: creates, edits/processes audio, visual and multimedia titles and documentaries covering all major religious celebrations as well as charitable activities taking place in Prasanthi Nilayam (and beyond), and publishes related multimedia such as CDs, DVDs, etc.

(iv) Publications Division: prints, publishes and distributes books – spiritual, religious and other titles on Education in Human Values; prints and publishes a monthly spiritual journal 'Sanathana Sarathi' in English and Telugu languages; runs a library and reading room, etc.

(v) Brindavan Bhaktha Sahayak Division: runs a canteen, a telephone booth, daily needs unit and a Goshala at Brindavan, Whitefield, Bangalore.

SRI SATHYA SAI MEDIA FOUNDATION

The Trust, which started functioning in 2007-08, promotes preserves, protects and disseminates knowledge relating to philosophy, Indian culture and heritage and human values with special reference to teachings of Baba.

SRI SATHYA SAI EASWARAMMA WOMEN'S WELFARE TRUST

The Trust provides continuous Antenatal & post-natal care to women, free of cost, in the villages surrounding Puttaparthi with the help of a fully equipped medical van.

Around 130 villages are covered in the Puttaparthi, Bukkapatnam, Kothacheruvu and Nallamada mandals. The Trust has been registered under Andhra Pradesh Charitable and Hindu Religious Institutions and Endowments Act 1987.

SMT. EASWARAMMA EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY

This Society, formed in August 1972, has been running a Telugu Medium High School for the last several years. An English Medium School has been started last year by the Society.

The following independent trust operates outside Prashanthi Nilayam:

SRI SATHYA SAI LOK SEVA TRUST

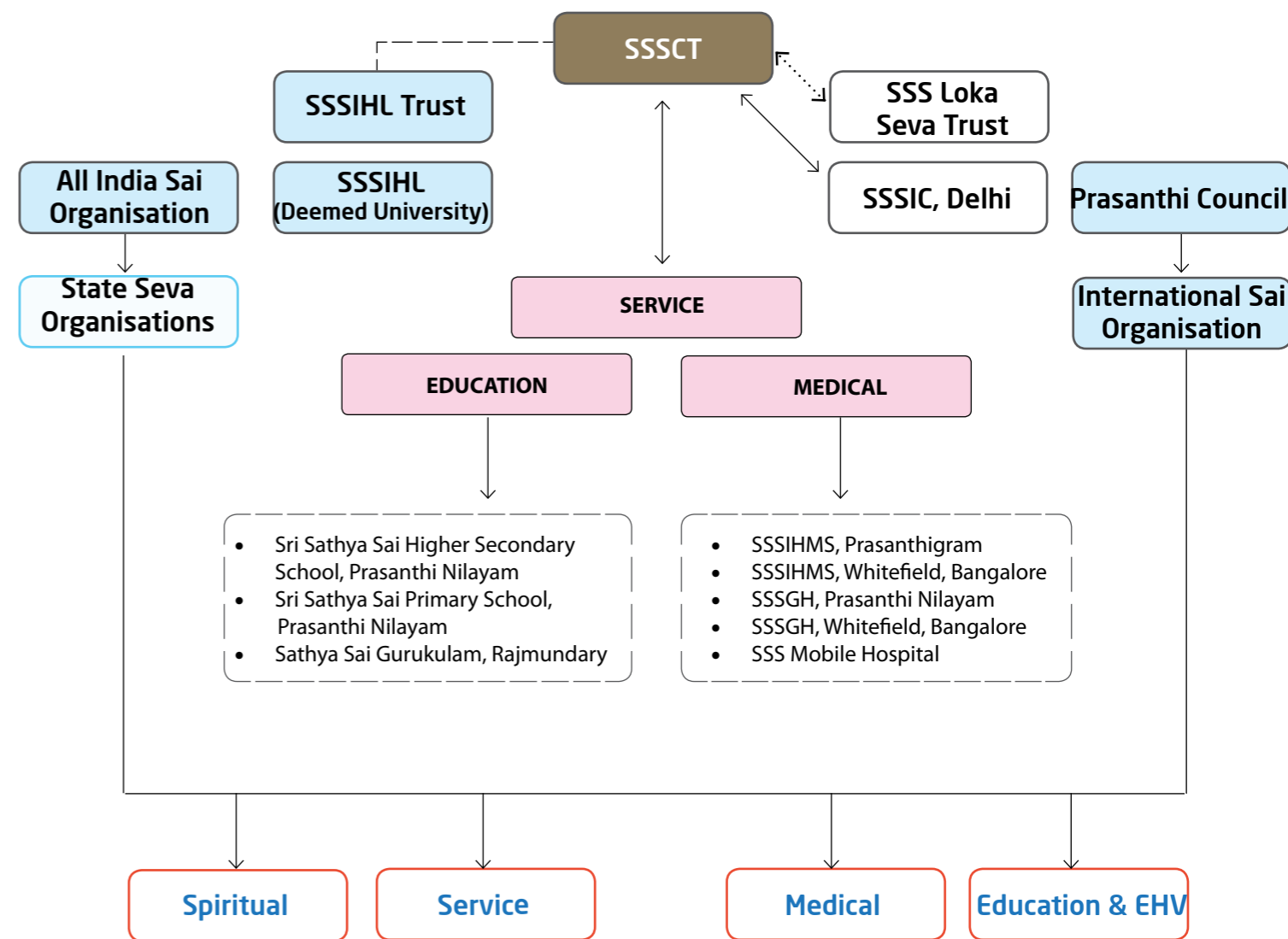
This Trust is registered in Karnataka. It has been running schools in Alike and Muddenahalli in Karnataka. Each Trustee is appointed by the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust.

In several states, there are Trusts functioning under the name of "Sri Sathya Sai Trust (name of the state)". Except four Trusts, the rest are independent Trusts and the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has no legal connection with them.

In the case of the four Trusts in Bihar, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and Haryana, the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has the power to nominate the Trustees.

There are some Sai Trusts and Foundations functioning abroad. They are totally independent bodies, founded by Bhagawan. Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has no connection with them.

FINANCIALS

The financial information provided in this segment is for the Period 1 April 2010 to 31 March 2011 only.

The table shows the payments under capital expenditure and revenue expenditure incurred by the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust and associated Trusts. Staff cost includes the wages and salaries paid. A breakup of how these costs are incurred under our major heads of education, medical and other welfare activities has also been given.

It will thus be seen that out of the total expenditure of Rs 96.18 crore (revenue and capital), nearly Rs 87.41 crore (90 %), has been spent in service and welfare activities, consistent with the objectives of the Trust.

Compliance

Our books of Accounts are being regularly audited by an eminent firm of auditors. Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust has consistently adhered to procedures of regulatory compliance with the laws of various departments of the Government.

The Trust files income tax returns every year, and responds to any follow-up queries by the Income Tax Department.

Income Tax Return for the assessment year 2011-2012 was filed on 30th September 2011. The Trust has been regularly submitting the required reports to the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Government of India under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act, 1976. FCRA return for the financial year 2009-2010 was filed on 29th November 2010.

Return for 2010-2011 will be filed before the due date.

We have been filing a copy of the annual financial statements along with a statement giving details of additions/deletions to the assets of the Trust, with the Assistant Commissioner of Endowments, Anantapur every year as per sub-section 10 of section 43 of the above Act (Report for the year 2009-2010 was filed on 29th January 2011). The Trust has been prompt and timely in its history of compliance.

Social Impact

Various governments, over the years, have often placed on record their commendations for the many public welfare projects undertaken by the Trust and their impact on society.

The Anantapur Water Supply Project has had the distinction of being mentioned in the Ninth Five Year Plan as a project that is worthy of emulation. The Third World Water Forum held at Mexico in March 2006 adjudged Anantapur Water Project as one of the ten best Local Action Projects in the world contributing to the Millennium Development Goals.

The value of the projects executed by the Trust and offered to the Government and public so far, in the area of drinking water supply alone, is around Rs 500 crore.

The cascading impact of this on the beneficiaries also has been significant and has been commended by several agencies.

SRI SATHYA SAI CENTRAL TRUST (Medical Care Division) (Formerly called Sri Sathya Sai Medical Trust)

High quality medical care, in recent decades, has gone beyond the reach of the very people who are most vulnerable to disease. The poor and economically challenged are therefore resigned to a reality where they neither have knowledge of prevention of disease nor access to medical care. It was with the aim of creating access to the best of medical care for needy patients, completely free of charge, that Baba established the Sri Sathya Sai Medical Trust on 9th September, 1991.

The Medical Trust managed the hospitals set up by Baba up to 30th November, 2010. Thereafter, the hospitals were handed over to the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust for running and maintenance. Health care with a human face has been an important guideline for the Trust over the years.

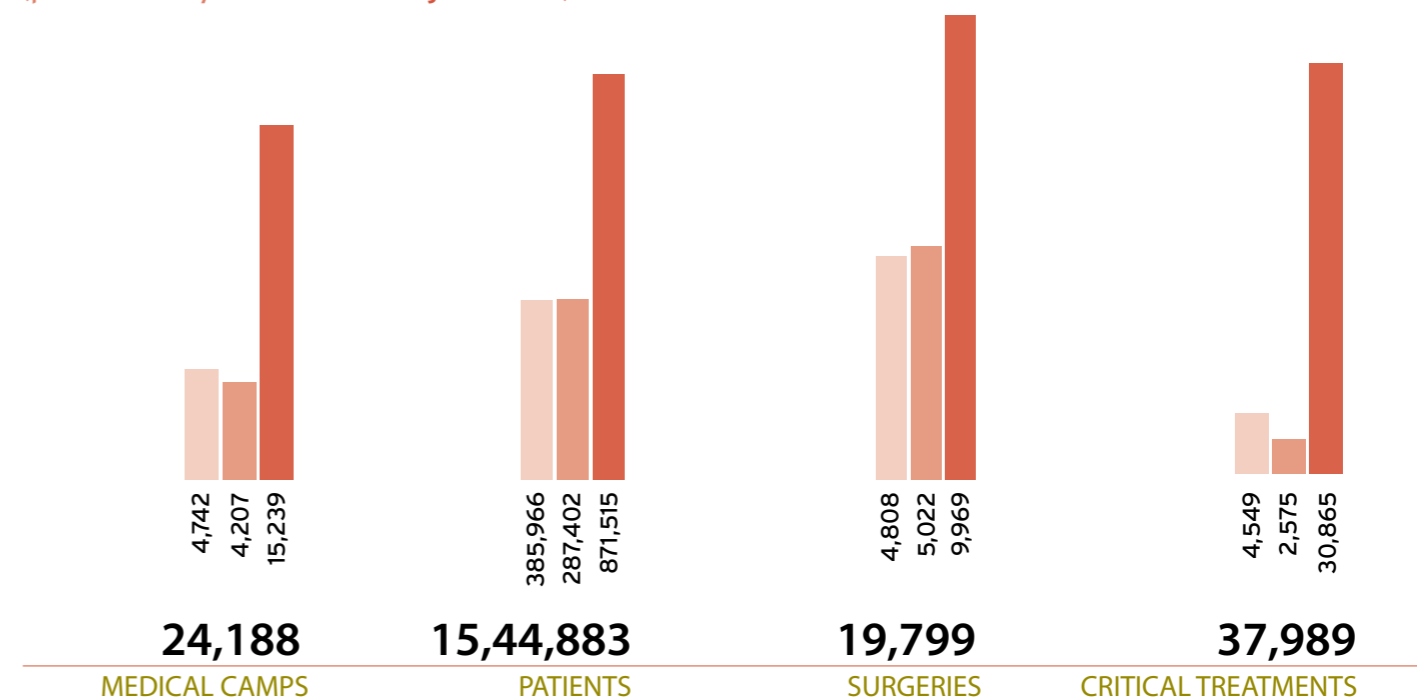
Medical activities directed by Baba are based on four key principles- Globalisation, De-commercialisation, Humanisation and Spiritualisation.

The Trust operates two super-speciality hospitals: (1) Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (SSSIHMS), Prasanthigram (established on 22nd November, 1991) located in Anantapur district of Andhra Pradesh and (2) Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences, Whitefield (established on 19th January, 2001) located in Bangalore, Karnataka.

In addition to providing tertiary level healthcare, the Trust also extends secondary level

healthcare through two general hospitals - Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Prasanthi Nilayam, (established on 4th October, 1956) and Sri Sathya Sai General Hospital, Whitefield (established on 28th August, 1976). The Trust also runs Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital (established 30th March, 2006), a medical outreach programme for the benefit of the rural poor.

All the hospitals provide advanced techniques of diagnosis and medical care. Outpatients and inpatients benefit from the excellent care including diagnosis, investigations, surgery, and medicines. The whole service is absolutely free of cost. In fact, there is no bill-

collection counter in any of these hospitals.

The two super-speciality hospitals have since their inception examined more than 2.9 million out-patients and performed over 2,30,000 surgeries. Nearly 65 per cent of the patients treated at the two hospitals belong to families with an annual income of less than Rs 20,000 per annum (approximately US\$ 400).

The general hospitals and mobile hospital serve a minimum of over 700 patients each per day, with majority of them belonging to the poorer sections of the society.

The first unit of Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Medical Sciences (SSSIHMS) was inaugurated on 22nd November, 1991 by Sri P.V. Narasimha Rao, Honourable Prime Minister of India at Prasanthigram. This 230-bed architectural marvel built on 150 acres of land with a built-up area of 1,53,000 sq. ft. offers complete tertiary care in the following areas:

- **Cardiology and Cardiothoracic Surgery (CTVS)**
- **Urology**
- **Plastic Surgery**
- **Ophthalmology**
- **Orthopaedics**
- **Gastroenterology**

Currently, 28 postgraduate students are undergoing training to qualify for the Certificate of Diplomate of National Board in various disciplines approved by the National Board of Examinations, New Delhi. This includes super-specialties in medical sciences viz. Cardio Thoracic and Vascular Surgery, Cardiology, and Urology and sub-specialties of Ophthalmology, Anaesthesiology and Orthopaedics.

Some of the recent events and activities undertaken by the hospital are:

- Sri Sathya Sai International Orthopaedic Conference, July 22-24, 2011. About 150

delegates and faculty from India and abroad attended the conference on the theme: "Pelvis and lower extremity fractures".

- Visit by a delegation from Tamil Nadu State Health Department. A delegation of senior persons from the Tamil Nadu Health Department headed by the Director of Medical Education, Dr. Vamsadhara visited the hospital on September 26th, 2011. The visit was a part of an exercise to understand the best practices in the health care delivery system of our hospital and emulate the model in the hospitals being set up at district level by the Tamil Nadu Government.

SRI SATHYA SAI INSTITUTE OF HIGHER MEDICAL SCIENCES, Whitefield, Bengaluru

SSSIHMS, Whitefield, is a 333-bed wholly charitable hospital with built-up area of 3, 54,000 sq. ft. It is built on 52.26 acres of land, which was provided free of cost by the Government of Karnataka. The lush green landscaping, spacious areas for patients besides the breathtaking majesty of the building are some of the unique design features of this hospital that create an atmosphere, conducive to the wholesome healing of its patients.

This super-speciality hospital offers complete tertiary care in the areas of:

- **Departments of Cardiology and Cardiothoracic Surgery (CTVS)**
- **Department of Neurology**
- **Department of Neuro-surgery**

The hospital also offers the following academic courses:

- **Post-Doctoral- Fellowship Program in Interventional Cardiology.**
- **Post-Graduate- DNB Residency Program in Broad and Super Specialties.**
- **Under-Graduate- B.Sc Nursing and Allied Health Sciences**

SRI SATHYA SAI MOBILE HOSPITAL

Healthcare at the Doorstep

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Hospital is a unique and free rural outreach holistic health service launched by Baba on March 30th, 2006. A unit of the SSS Medical Trust, it operates from the 1st to 12th of every month at 12 nodal points or base villages to each of which are attached 6 villages. Seventy two villages are thus serviced by the Mobile Hospital, though in practice patients are drawn from nearly 400 villages.

The hospital on wheels is operated almost entirely on a voluntary basis. Five hundred doctors from the state of Andhra Pradesh belonging to 12 specialties dedicate their skills and serve in rotation. This diagnostic bus comes equipped with an ultra sonogram, x-ray plant with automatic processor and a laboratory, which can perform most of the pathological and bio-chemical investigations. The presence of this diagnostic support renders quality and credibility to the work.

Since the programme is outreach, a larger agenda was visualized as the driving theme of this service based on a triangular approach consisting of, Curative thrust, Preventive focus and Spiritual base.

The curative thrust owes its strength to the presence of specialists belonging to 9 specialties on any particular day namely; Radiology, Medicine, Surgery, Orthopedics, ENT, Dentistry, Ophthalmology, Gynecology & Pediatrics.

It is further strengthened by a strong pharmacy which ensures that patients with chronic ailments like epilepsy, diabetes, hypertension, heart disease and asthma are all provided with continuous and uninterrupted supply of medicines (one month's worth till the next visit).



SSS Mobile Hospital

Patients requiring follow-up treatment like surgical intervention are referred to our network of super specialty hospitals and their problems are monitored till logical solutions are arrived.

On the diagnostic front, the team has an innovative system in place for the tests that cannot be undertaken on the bus.

Samples are collected and delivered to the SSS Super Specialty Hospital for testing and reporting, thus ensuring that Baba's objective of providing a loving door-step service is achieved.

The preventive work consists of health education, which is done both intensively and extensively. This awareness drive is based on five major themes: cleanliness (environmental, home & individual), nutrition, healthy air and water, harmful effects of habits like smoking and alcoholism, proper physical exercise and mind relaxation have been selected.

Education on these subjects is offered at the individual, family and community levels using a variety of tools like audiovisual presentations, demonstrative sessions, interactive meets and photo exhibition. It is further reinforced by broadcasting it regularly through the local cable television.

The spiritual base of the service involves educating and motivating the villagers on the importance of positive thinking, human values, and age-old practices like prayer and meditation all of which foster positive health. With this holistic strategy, a large percentage of community's health problems are solved because the approach is professional, proactive, integrated and takes care of common ailments, chronic ailments, preventive ailments, asymptomatic diseases and endemic diseases. Only problems requiring major surgical intervention are referred to the base hospitals.

The success of this project has triggered a domino effect in other states such as Maharashtra where a fleet of 29 such hospitals on wheels are being deployed to serve

remote and neglected areas. Twenty of these vans, each one allotted to various districts, namely, Mumbai, Thane, Nasik, Pune, Solapur, Nanded, to name a few, have been in service for almost a year, serving six hundred thousand villagers in the interiors of Maharashtra.

The Sai Mobile Hospitals bring, in addition to a state-of-the-art rural outreach service, a state-of-the-heart caring and loving service to rural India.

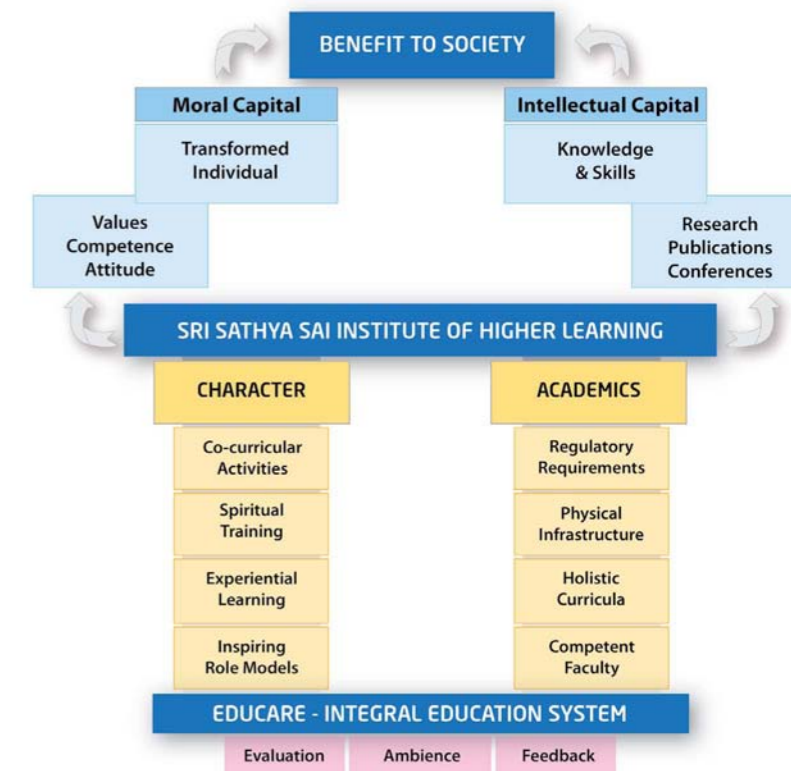

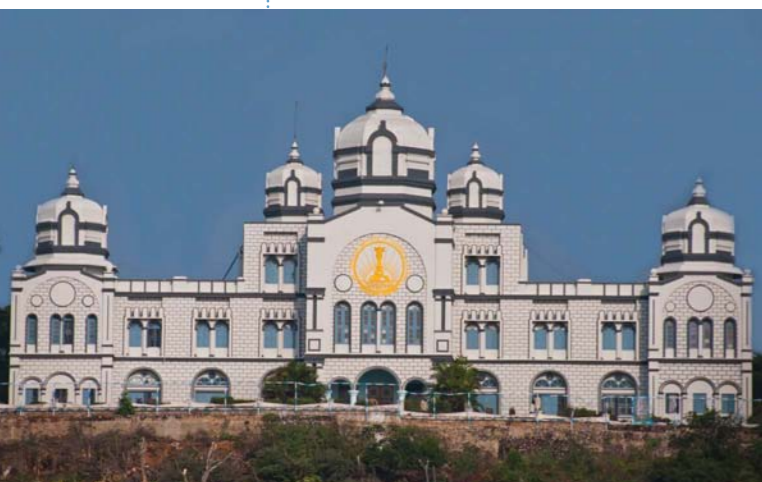

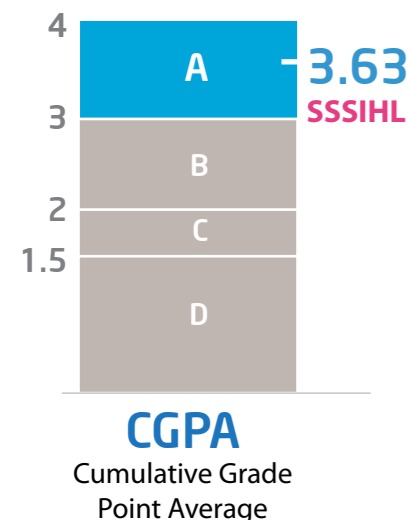

Academic Excellence at SSSIHL

In January 2011, The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) – an autonomous body established by the University Grants Commission (UGC), that monitors and evaluates the quality of higher education in India – granted Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning (Deemed to be University) re-accreditation with 'A' Grade and a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.625 (on a scale of 4.00). This means that SSSIHL continues to be in the top bracket of Indian Universities.

Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning provides free education (with no fees whatsoever being charged to students for tuition, examinations, labs etc.) to all students. It has a merit-based and open admissions policy for all, irrespective of income, religion or region. The University adopts the Government of India Policy for students from the Scheduled Castes (SCs), and the Scheduled Tribes (STs).

There are three academic Faculties and eleven Departments at the Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning. Each Faculty has a full-time Dean and all departments have a full-time Head. The design of

academic programmes at SSSIHL is such that most degrees require students to study courses that are across multiple disciplines.

Evaluation and Mentoring

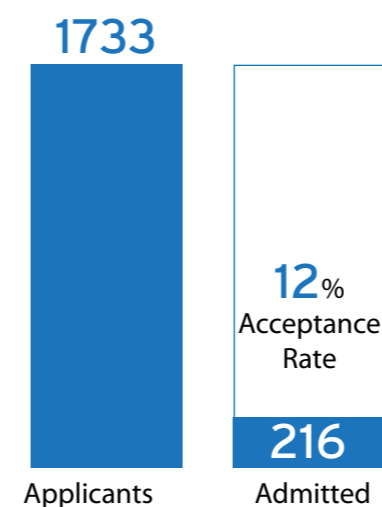
SSSIHL adopts a Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) measure whereby the student is evaluated on an ongoing basis throughout each semester of their studies. This ensures that students have a sound and conceptual understanding of the subject. It is also very dedicated to the cause of transforming theoretical knowledge into skills.

For students studying the Sciences, the afternoon classes are devoted to laboratory sessions. Those pursuing the Social Sciences, Arts, and Management disciplines dedicate 50 per cent of their weekly class time learning to internalize the concepts studied.

This is done through case-studies, self-feedback exercises, role plays, management games, group discussions, outdoor exercises, etc. The University has introduced a mentoring system whereby a resident teacher mentors a maximum of 8-10 students every year. This helps the student to blossom in both academic as well as the co-curricular activities of the University. Furthermore, these

This facilitates better rapport between teachers and students, and creates an environment for the teacher to help the student in all aspects of the SSSIHL experience.

The Revered Founder Chancellor constantly emphasised that bookish knowledge must be converted into practical knowledge. The University has always endeavoured to implement this idea. The research thrust of the University is conceptualised with societal benefit in mind, and all research projects, regardless of department or subject area, must incorporate this.

This re-orientes the focus of both the faculty and the students of that department towards the achievement of both academic and social excellence.

The University has a twin modular research programme that enables interested candidates to pursue a Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) or a Doctoral Research (Ph.D.) Programme. Many of the research projects undertaken



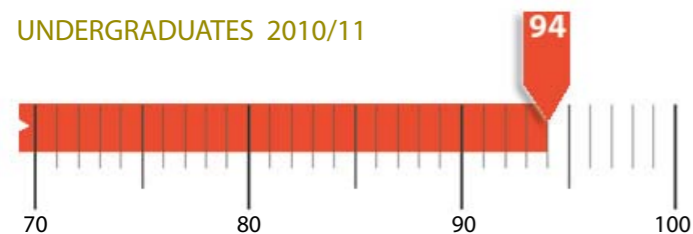

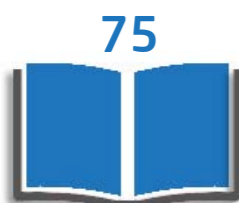

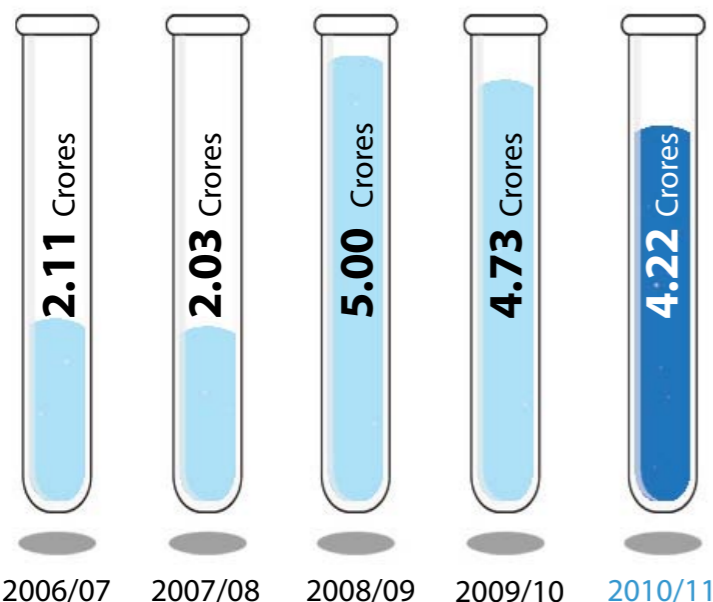

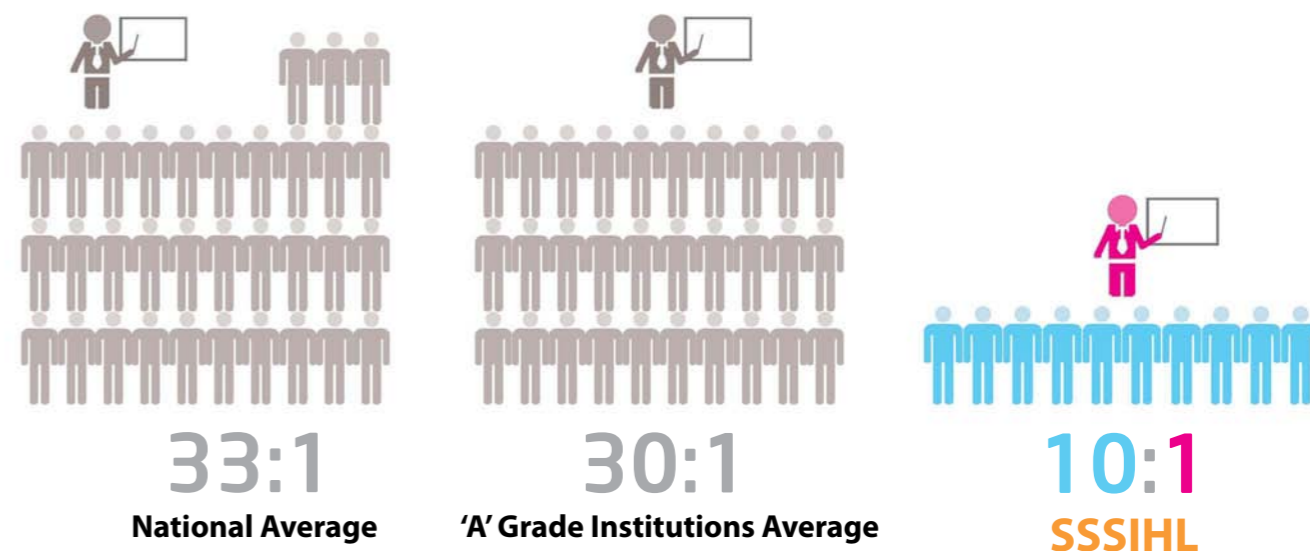

STUDENT-TEACHER RATIO

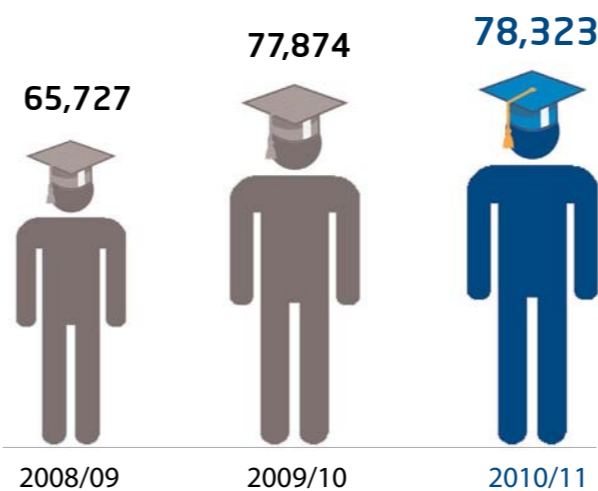

The school at every step, big or small, is guided by the comprehensive educational philosophy of Bhagawan Baba who emphatically advocates “Education should be for life; not for mere living”.

Objectives

True education should produce balanced personality in whom intellectual, emotional and spiritual values are harmoniously developed. Therefore, all the learning programmes in the school are structured to inculcate in the learners the qualities of:

Affiliation

It is fully residential English Medium School for boys and girls affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi [CBSE]. 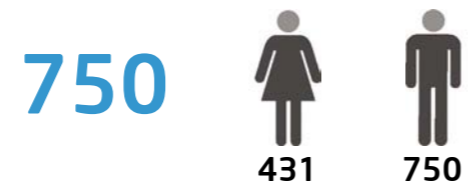
Audio-Visual Room

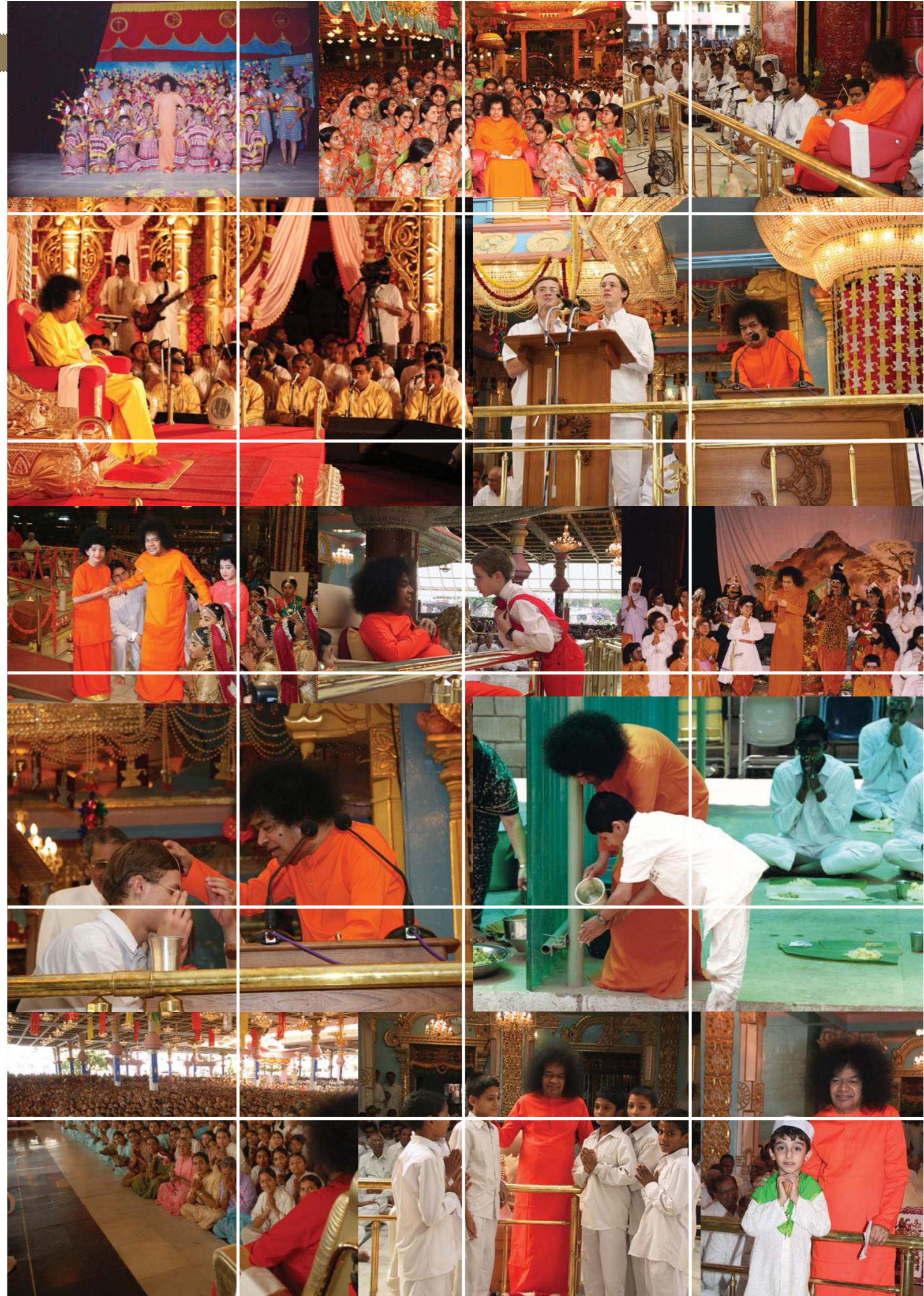

NEW INITIATIVE - SRI SATHYA SAI VIDYA VAHINI

On the occasion of Baba's 85th birthday on 23 November 2010, He initiated the Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini project- an innovative project that is set to transform the education landscape of rural India. Using web-based tools to enhance the learning opportunities for village children, it brings together cutting-edge technology, values-based learning models, secular curricula and teacher training under one umbrella. Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini uses technology to meet the educational needs of millions of Indians deprived of this basic right.

It strives to achieve the aspects of cognitive thinking, motivation and empowered action by using technology to deliver a synthesis of values-based education and curriculum. Its methods of teaching include articulation and expression of values in core subjects (cognitive thinking), conscious involvement of teachers in exemplifying the values (motivation), and the all-inclusive participation of students in service-based projects (empowered action).

There will be no fee charged to the beneficiary schools and students whatsoever.

Objectives of the Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vahini Project

The core objective of the project is to infuse Education in Human Values in today's secular education. It also aims to bring higher quality to syllabi followed in schools. It also aims to bring higher quality in syllabi adhered to in schools. To generate enthusiasm for learning among students standard one up, the project aims at deploying teaching techniques that:

1. Infuse Human Values into the curriculum.
2. Assimilate activity-based learning through practical, hands-on exercises

3. Nurture the application of concepts to real-life situations and challenges
4. Encourage collaborative content generation that leverages the strengths of:
 - Experienced teachers and their teaching techniques
 - Multimedia experts for converting ideas into animations
 - IT experts for building and maintaining a collaborative platform that can bring the much-needed support to the students and teachers in remote areas from their peers in well-endowed schools and volunteers
5. Combine multimedia content for easy grasp of complex concepts
6. Empower teachers and volunteers who work in remote areas with rich content and best teaching practices
7. Leverage the reach of the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation (SSSSO) and volunteer base to overcome the challenges of technology adoption.

Over the year, the project has been initiated in 13 schools (including three pilot schools) and nine education boards across ten Indian states. It may, however, be noted that only phase-one of the project has thus far been deployed in these schools.

A testimonial to this is the composition of the Sathya Sai Organisation Samithis or Bhajan Mandalis across the country. They consist of members of different strata of society, sometimes of different ethnic groups, all pursuing their respective faiths but joining together in the service of mankind with the firm faith that Manava Seva (Service to Man) is Madhava Seva (Service to God).

Currently, there are more than 6,00,000 members in the Organisation with over 7,800 bhajan centres, over 3,00,000 bal vikas students, 17,500 bal vikas teachers.

Objectives of the Organisation

The principal objectives of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation are:

- To help the individual
- To be aware of the Divinity that is inherent in him and to conduct himself accordingly;
- To translate into practice in daily life, divine love and perfection; and therefore
- To fill one's life with joy, harmony, beauty, grace, human excellence and lasting happiness;
- To ensure that all human relations are governed by the principles of Sathya (Truth), Dharma (Right Conduct), Shanthi (Peace), Prema (Love) and Ahimsa (Non-violence).
- To make devotees more sincere and dedicated in the practice of their respective religions by understanding properly the true spirit of their religion.



Disaster Relief

How are the Objectives attained?

The above-mentioned objectives are attained in the following manner:

- By observing the four principles laid down by Bhagawan Baba, namely:
 - There is only One religion, the religion of Love
 - There is only One caste, the caste of humanity
 - There is only One language, the language of the Heart
 - There is only One God, He is omnipresent.
- By constant remembrance of God and looking upon all creation as a manifestation of Divinity in different forms and shapes;
- By underlining the essential unity of all religions and securing proper understanding of all religions as being based on Love;
- By looking upon all work as service dedicated to the Divine;
- By bringing to bear upon all life's problems, attitudes flowing from Divine Love, such as, understanding, compassion, tolerance, helpfulness, etc.
- By basing all actions on Love of Divinity, fear of sin and steadfast observance of morality in society;
- By engaging in spiritual, educational and service activities, both at the individual and community level, in an organized, systematic manner, without expecting any material reward or appreciation, but solely as a means to win God's Love and Grace.

Ethos of the Organisation

The Organisation has three wings - Spiritual, Service and Educational. The Spiritual Wing undertakes activities such as Devotional Singing (bhajans and nagarsankeertan), Study Circles, Discourses, and Jyoti Meditation. The Service Wing carries on social uplift activities across a very wide spectrum in villages, slums, hospitals, orphanages, disaster relief, poor feeding, employment training, and such. The Educational Wing

is involved in the non-formal educational training of children in the age group 5-14 years, human values-based educational training called Sai Educare, Adult Literacy Programmes, etc.

All the services rendered by the Organisation across its three wings are completely free of cost. There is also no membership fee of any kind.

Structure of the Organisation

The Sai Organisation, from small beginnings in a remote little hamlet, in South India, has grown into a well-knit, purposeful and service-oriented global organisation of dedicated men and women. With its organisational units in all Indian states, it is striving every day selflessly to bring in a new world order governed by peace, love, unity and harmony.

Today, the Organisation is active in all the states of India. It is headed by an All India President, who is assisted by the All-India Coordinators of Spiritual, Educational and Service wing. Each state has a State President who manages the activities for the region, helped by District Coordinators.

Activities of the Organisation

The Sri Sathya Sai Organisation is perhaps the only charitable organisation in the world that has single-handedly taken up holistic development projects across the length and breadth of the country.

Some of the notable activities undertaken are:

Sri Sathya Sai Village Integrated Programme

The SSSVIP addresses the holistic needs of a villager and thus, the village. The key to this is the nurturing of the family unit as the foundation. It is structured on the "bottom up" principle starting from each family in the village.

The eight main components of the SSSVIP are: infrastructure, employment, education, medical and health, social, spiritual and individual care. By recognising the emotional toll that acute deprivation exacts, the SSSVIP addresses the concerns of the body, the mind, the poverty-bruised emotions and defeated spirits of these disadvantaged individuals.

Once a specific village is identified, a basic survey is conducted to assess the common and individual needs and then the components are prioritised accordingly. Throughout the process, SSSVIP volunteers visit the villages to build positive relations with all stakeholders involved.

The project has met with commendable success so far. It has within a span of three years now been extended to 1,300 villages across India even as it continues to grow.

Disaster Relief and Management

The Sai volunteers or Seva Dals are specially trained in disaster management. They have in the past rendered service under arduous conditions during the Gujarat earthquake, Tsunami in Tamil Nadu, floods in Orissa, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka, to mention just a few. These apart, the Organisation also regularly takes up

work during festivals such as the Ganga Sagar Mela in Bengal performing sanitation work, the Pushkaram festivals of Krishna and Godavari rivers, etc.

During the floods in Orissa and the earthquake in Sikkim in 2011, the Organisation rendered invaluable disaster relief service.

Its specialized Disaster Management Training Programmes have now been extended to the Tamil Nadu Police Department as well

Technology Group Activities

These consist of assistance to low cost housing and sanitation, water purification, organic agriculture, micro hydel power generation, solar power usage, Bio Mass devices, etc. The Sai Organisation has been instrumental in providing these amenities in many villages across the country.

TeleMedicine Centres

Fully equipped centres staffed by qualified doctors have been set up in Barrackpur (near Kolkata) and Bhubaneshwar. These centres enable interaction of the patients with the Sathya Sai Super Specialty Hospitals at Puttaparthi and Bangalore in Cardio Thoracic, Neurological and Neurosurgical diseases. All services provided are totally free of cost.

Medical Rehabilitation

Patients treated at the Sathya Sai Super Specialty Hospitals are followed up at their places of residence in Kerala, Karnataka, West Bengal and Orissa for post-operative treatment and care for cardiac diseases by the Sai Organisation.

Sai Net

The Organisation is implementing its own dedicated web-based communication system entitled Sai Net, which will reach out to all the 6, 00,000 members.

Digital Archives

It is also setting up a nation-wide digital archive system to record, store and retrieve all activities throughout the country.

Multifaith Activities

The Organisation regularly also takes up service activities in Temples, Mosques, Gurudwaras, and Churches.

Funding Details

All the activities undertaken by the Sri Sathya Sai Organisation are typically funded internally by the members voluntarily. Donations and contributions are never solicited. A large pool of ready volunteers is our greatest strength.

The overseas wing of the Sathya Sai Organisations is also a spiritual humanitarian organisation; it does not belong to any religion and does not preach any. It expresses itself through three activities: Spiritual, Educational and Social Service.

The spiritual activity covers spiritual awareness and the devotional aspects of behavior developed through study circles, devotional singing, meditation, self-discipline and moral conduct.

The educational activity offers to children, youth and adults diversified programmes in order realize in daily life the practical aspects of the human values: Love, Truth, Right Action, Peace and Non-violence.

Service is, in general, a binding requirement for every individual, whether he is a devotee or not.

The International Sri Sathya Sai Organisation is divided into nine international zones. Within these zones, there are 125 countries and over 2,000 Sri Sathya Sai Centers, all engaged in activities represented by the three wings of the organisation: Devotion, Selfless Service, and Education.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS 2010-11

World Conference

The 9th world conference in 2010 drew delegates from 114 countries. Before this, there were Pre-world conferences in Japan, South America, Mexico, Southern Europe, Russia, Canada, Germany, Australia, UK and Nigeria.

The theme of the Pre-World Conference comprised three of the supreme pronouncements of Baba, viz., 'God Is', 'I Am I', and 'Love All, Serve All'.

Disaster Relief Operations with International Support

HAITI

On 12 January 2010, when the small island country of Haiti was hit by a deadly earthquake, it devastated vast stretches of many a populated city. Measuring 7.0 on the Richter scale, the quake left a trail of devastation, killing about 250,000 people and rendering about 1.5 million homeless.

Relief operation by Sri Sathya Sai International Organisation began promptly with the loving care from the members of the organisation from the Dominican Republic and Haiti. Narayan seva began with Sai devotees from Puerto Rico, Venezuela and Santo Domingo serving 1,100 meals and water daily to patients at a hospital.

This rose to 2,000 meals per day by the following month. Tents for shelter, food and clothing were also provided. A water tanker and a well-designed network of pipelines started delivering 6,000 gallons of much needed potable water to the earthquake victims.

Three teams of doctors and volunteers from South America, Central America and the U.S.A and Canada

arrived in late January and provided healthcare to about 3,500 patients in the very first week of operation. Additional volunteers arrived in Haiti every week, serving about 300 patients every day.

By the end of August, 44,000 patients had been seen. An ophthalmologist soon joined the team followed by a psychiatrist and a psychologist to treat those suffering from post-traumatic stress disorders.

INDONESIA

The Sathya Sai Organisation in Indonesia has responded quickly to the earthquakes, tsunamis and volcanic eruptions in the country. Some details of this are given below:

- Earthquake at Padang, West Sumatra- Date of incidence: 30th September 2011, magnitude of 7.6 & 6.2 Richter scale.
- Earthquake followed by Tsunami in Mentawai Island in the West Coast of Sumatra. Date of incidence: 25th October 2011.
- Mount Merapi eruption- Date of incidence: 25th October 2011.

The Sathya Sai Organisation distributed food items, life jackets, medicines and dispatched doctor and nurse volunteers.

JAPAN

On 11 March 2011, when an earthquake and a Tsunami devastated Japan in deadly tandem, members of the Sathya Sai Organisation rushed to the island to answer desperate appeals of emergency. The official death toll was estimated at 11,000 with more than 17,000 people missing, and over 1,90,000 people in temporary shelters.

Twenty physicians from the SSSO responded immediately to calls from Police and medical officials from the Miyagi Prefecture to facilitate pre-cremation medical processing of the mounting number of corpses retrieved from the disaster zone.

Volunteers also delivered seven truckloads carrying 40 tonnes of lifeline goods and food supplies directly to survivors. The Japan Coast Guard offered an entire ship for the transportation of supplies to the most severely affected areas in the Miyagi and Iwate Prefectures.

EAST AFRICA FAMINE RELIEF

Somalia, Ethiopia and Northern Kenya are experiencing the worst drought in 60 years. There has been no rain in the region over the past three years. The total population affected now stands at 13.3 million.

The Sri Sathya Sai Organisation in Kenya is preparing itself to serve the people in this time of dire need. On 11 September 2011, a team deputed by the organisation went to Kyuso district and evaluated and executed planned distribution.

Sai Spiritual Education

Globally, Sathya Sai Schools and Institutes of Sai Spiritual Education (ISSEs) are two primary institutional mechanisms for the delivery of Sathya Sai Education in Human Values, or SSEHV.

The International Sathya Sai Organisation developed a comprehensive set of educational guidelines for Sathya Sai Schools and Institutes of Education which were approved by Baba and adopted in 2009.

This has facilitated the establishment of new Sathya Sai Institutes of Education in the USA, Canada, South Europe (Italy), Indonesia and Nepal that have started offering diploma courses for teacher training in Sathya Sai Schools, other public schools and community Sathya Sai Education in Human Values programmes.

The table below indicates the number of schools and Institutes of Sathya Sai Education established in four continents outside India.
